

## Microsoft® Internet Explorer 7 (IE7)

### How to Use the Content Advisor


#### Use this document if:

- You want to use the Content Advisor feature in Microsoft® Internet Explorer 7 (IE7).
  - Internet Explorer Content Advisor allows you to control the content your computer can access over the Internet.
  - You may establish a password that must be entered by a user with administrative rights, before accessing certain Web sites.
  - After enabling Content Advisor, only sites that meet your established criteria can be displayed without entering the password.


#### This document assumes:

- You have IE7 installed and are using it.
- You are connected to the Internet.


1. In the Windows Taskbar, select **Tools**. Then, select **Internet Options**.



2. In the "Internet Options" window, select the **Content** tab.



3. Select **Enable** to display the Content Advisor form. (If you've already enabled Content Advisor, select **Settings**. Then, type the **supervisor password**. The Content Advisor form will display.)





4. Select a category in the list, then drag the slider to set the limits. Repeat this process for each category you want to limit. Then, select **OK**.

5. If a supervisor password has not already been set up, you'll be prompted to create one.

Note: Keep your password in a safe place. If lost, you'll have to repeat this entire process. Your password is also needed to turn off the content advisor.

6. To view restricted content, select the **General** tab in the Content Advisor form. Then select **Supervisor Can Type A Password To Allow Users To View Restricted Content**.

7. To view unrated content: Select **Users Can See Sites That Have No Rating**. Select **OK**.

Note: Not all Internet content is rated. If you choose to allow viewing of unrated sites on your computer, some sites could contain inappropriate material. To learn more about site ratings, visit the Microsoft® Web site ([www.microsoft.com](http://www.microsoft.com)).
